Celebrations from last year

- Children achieved higher results in reading, writing and Maths in EYFS last year with 97% of children achieving expected or higher than expected at the end of EYFS.
- Children at the end of Key Stage One 86% reading, 86% writing and 86% maths made expected or above expected level of attainment
- Introduction of Growth Mindset where the children are able to verbalise where they are in their learning and are talking about what helps them to learn as well as displaying a real resilience in their learning.
- New curriculum has been planned to engage and enthuse the children including a wide range of trips and visits locally and further afield
- 87% of Y1 pupils are working at expected levels in the Phonics Screening check. The Y2 pupils who were retested in Phonics; 93% of pupils working at expected levels. This is an upward trajectory on the previous year.
- All children engaged in dance lessons with our specialist dance teacher
- All children were taught sports by trained coaches and accessed a broader curriculum
- Children took part in the HASSP Sports Partnership enabling them to perform and compete against other children from surrounding schools in Early Years Multi skills, Athletics, dance, and Cross Country
- Wide range of G&T activities to enable children with specific talents to work alongside others with Network Schools; Musical theatre
- Introduction of "The Daily Mile" each day where children "run" a mile at the beginning of each day to promote children's well being and cognitive readiness for learning.

Sports Premium Funding

We continue to receive funding this year from the Government to improve the quality of PE in our school.

We continue to work closely with the Junior School, St. Mary's School, Cuddington and Dinton School and Great Kimble School in the HASSP Partnership to enable our children to compete and perform against children in the local area.

We are using the same provider (IGNITE) to work alongside our teachers to train them to teach high quality sports at HCIS

Friday mornings IGNITE will continue teaching alongside our staff in all year groups. They will continue running extra curricular clubs and these are being planned as we speak.






What learning behaviours do we need to encourage in our children to allow them to...

Year 1 and 2 Music

Year R receive Music as part of their curriculum from Mrs Moore. They also have access to instruments within the classroom so that they can experiment and explore instruments and sounds on a daily basis.

Year 1 and 2 children learn Music with Mrs Ward, Miss Stainer and Mrs Crosland. All children in Year 1 and Year 2 will be learning the recorder as part of their music lesson. Y2 will be learning from the Autumn term and Year 1 will be learning from the Spring term.

Each child will need a recorder and recorder book which you can purchase through us or independently. An order form is now available for Y₂ and in the Spring term for Year 1.

The recorder book we will be using this year is 'Sing, Clap and Play the Recorder' by Heather Cox and Garth Rickard.

Mr Mitchener also takes peripatetic piano lessons on a Friday morning with children in Y1 and Year 2 for parents who would like this for their children.



Spellings

- * Each week the children in <u>Phonics phase 5 and 6</u> will receive a spelling list (year 1's will start after half term).
- * These spellings will either relate to the phonic sounds they are learning, be a selection of 'tricky' words or follow a spelling rule. The number of spellings will depend on their phonics stage (and range between 5 and 10 spellings).
- Please practise the spellings each week, we cannot emphasise enough how beneficial this will be for your child but we will not be formally testing them each week
- Teachers will be monitoring the use and application of these spellings on a daily basis; during phonics lessons (through a variety of games and activities) and in all of their writing.
- * You will receive a list of the year groups 'exception' words which cannot always be sounded out using phonics. These are the words the children are working towards learning to read and write by the end of the year.



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
