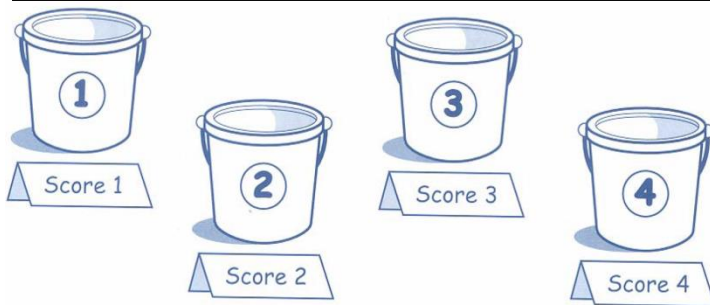

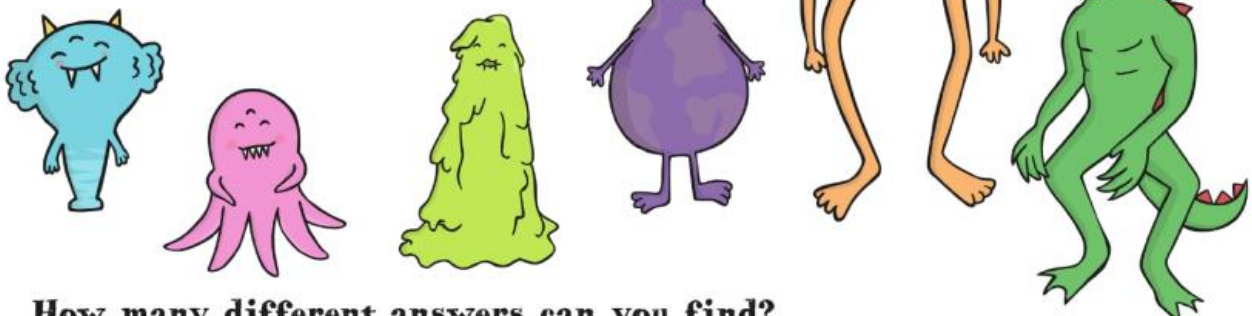


Space Monster Challenge

How many monsters had 2 eyes?

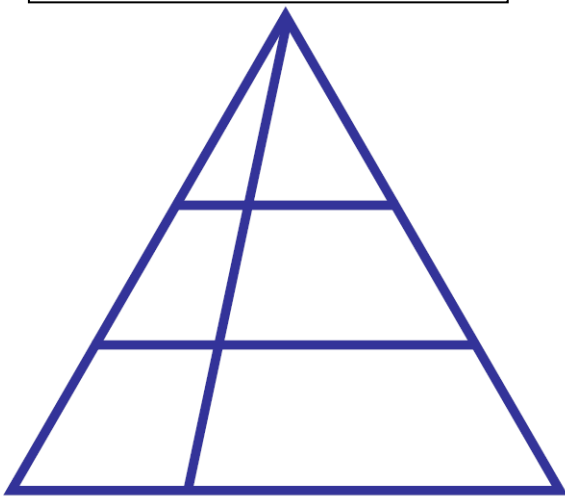


How many different answers can you find?.

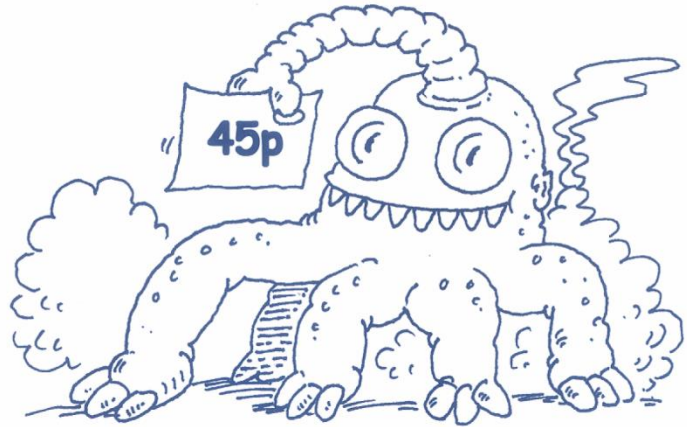
