Fisher German

Parent Forum

Thank you for feeding in your comments to the class reps and thank you to the class reps for attending the meeting on Monday. These were some of the things that were mentioned:

Workshops

The moving of our workshops came about after receiving feedback from parents combined with the low attendance at some of our workshops in the evening. At a number of our workshops for parents last year we were presenting to a handful of three or four parents which we felt was not really productive or helpful. We consulted parents asking for feedback and offering a range of other options in order to present to the majority of parents; including putting together video logs on the website so parents could access information as they suited. The overwhelming response was that parents still wanted us to run workshops which is great, so this year we decided to change the timings of these workshops in order to see if this would help parents attend at the start of the school day for a maximum of 20 minutes. This would mean that parents would then be able to go on to work and other commitments after attending. The workshops so far this year have been well attended attracting between 10-15 parents per class.

Tree Lighting and Harvest Assembly

We have been conscious of the number of activities that we ask the children to participate in and that we invite parents to. There needs to be a balance between these which are lovely and our classroom based time. These events do take time to organise which takes us out of the classroom. Therefore we reviewed the number of assemblies we invite parents to. We do still hold these assemblies however they are only for he children and involve less time out of the classroom which is more beneficial to the children's learning. We will revisit whether we open Harvest Assembly for parents next year.

Clubs

Some of our lunchtime clubs are held at the same time and we do understand that this may then cause a dilemma for some of our children. We are lucky to be able to offer so many different clubs, unfortunately this does mean that some are held on the same day and may involve some choice as to what your child signs up to. Every effort is made to provide a variety on one day however sometimes a clash is unavoidable if the teacher is only available on a particular day.

Cinema Trip
