World Book Day

We have made a few changes to the way we will celebrate World Book Day this year. In the past we have invited the children to dress up as their favourite book character. This year we will not be having a dress up day and instead are turning the focus back to books to encourage a love of reading and story telling. There will be many other activities organised for that week.

Some recent articles have discussed that when World Book Day was introduced in 1995,

‘the main aim was to encourage children to explore the pleasures of books and reading by providing them with the opportunity to have a book of their own. 1 in 8 disadvantaged children in the UK say they don’t have a book of their own. Children who say they have a book of their own are three times more likely to read above the level expected for their age than their peers who don’t own a book.’

We feel we should consider some alternatives to the norm of dressing up and take a step back to the place where the a LOVE of books and the POWER of stories is the focus.

Book Swap Shop

We want us all to become World Book Day Warriors and on Thursday 5th March we would like the children to bring to school between 1 to 4 books they have read that they are happy to swap. We will display all of the books in the hub and the children will have the opportunity to choose another book from the Swap Shop.

Focus on an Author

Each class will be focussing on a particular author during the week. They will share different stories by reading to other and there will be lots of other in class activities that week focussed around their particular author. The authors we will be exploring are: **YR—Julia Donaldson; Y1—Lauren Child; Y2—Oliver Jeffers**

Author Visits

We will have the pleasure of two authors coming to visit to hold assemblies, talks and writing workshops. These are:

Steve Cole—Friday 28th February

Sebastian Hockaday—Friday 6th March

There will be an opportunity for the children to buy a signed book by each author during their visit.

Steve Cole will be at school at pick up time to sign and sell his books at a reduced cost.

Sebastian Hockaday will be signing and selling his books during his visit in the school day. Please send your child in with money in a named sealed envelope if you would like them to buy his book. The children will not need any more than £5 per book.

Sponsored Readathon

During the week we will be running a sponsored reading and listening event. The aim of our event is to promote the love of reading and inspire us as World Book Day Warriors. During World Book Day week we are asking your child to be sponsored for the reading and listening they do at home. For example they could be sponsored for the length of time they read, number of pages, learning a new word. With the funds we raise we will buy new books for our library. We will send out a sponsor form nearer the time.
