Celebrations from last year

- * SATS results show that we are working above national expectations in Reading, and Writing with more children working at Greater Depth than nationally in all areas.
- * Children performed well in the HASSP Sports Partnership enabling them to perform and compete against other children from surrounding schools in Early Years Multi skills, Athletics, dance, and Cross Country.
- * Wellbeing programme Yoga sessions each week teaching children about their emotions and mindfulness.
- * Cursive handwriting was introduced much earlier in the school and as a result children's presentation and muscle memory for spelling has improved.

Sports Premium Funding and Sport provision

We continue to receive funding this year from the Government to improve the quality of PE in our school.

We continue to work closely with the Junior School, St. Mary's School, Cuddington and Dinton School and Great Kimble School in the HASSP Partnership to enable our children to compete and perform against children in the local area.

Laurence Clark who is also connected with FitLife in Haddenham is working alongside our teachers to train them to teach high quality sports at HCIS. These sessions are on Tuesday mornings.

Sports Factor (Mr A) has returned to run extra curricular sporting clubs on Tuesdays and Thursdays after school.

Haddenham Tennis Club still provide tennis coaching sessions on Tuesdays and Wednesday lunchtimes as well as providing the children with opportunities through special choosing on Friday afternoons

Year 1 and 2 Music

Year R receive Music as part of their curriculum from Mrs Moore. They also have access to instruments within the classroom so that they can experiment and explore instruments and sounds on a daily basis.

Year 1 and 2 children learn Music with Mrs Mander, Miss Stainer and Mrs Crosland. All children in Year 2 will be learning the recorder as part of their music lesson from the Spring term. Year 1 will begin recorders in the Summer Term.

Each child will need a recorder and recorder book which you can purchase through us or independently. An order form will become available at the end of this term.

The recorder book we will be using this year is 'Sing, Clap and Play the Recorder' by Heather Cox and Garth Rickard.

Mr Mitchener also takes peripatetic piano lessons on Mondays with children in Year 1 and Year 2 for parents who would like this for their children. He also runs a very popular Ukulele Club at lunchtime too.
