School Forum

Many thanks to our School Forum Reps who attended the meeting on Thursday 4th April and to all those parents who communicated their feedback to the reps.

We discussed particularly the review of the sporting clubs and the school trips each class had been on this term.

School Clubs

• Question: The changes that have been put in place—would these be reviewed?

Yes, we are constantly reviewing our clubs provision and asking for feedback. The change to the Thursday evening club moving to a lunch time was put in place because although this had been running all year, the numbers of children attending had not increased and still remained less than 10 children. We decided to move this club to Monday lunchtime to hopefully increase numbers of children attending and feedback had been that Thursday evenings was often a busier evening for parents with other commitments.

• Question: Would there be any other clubs such as dance/gymnastics considered?

Yes, we are hoping with the extra space created with our Wellbeing Hub we may be able to offer a greater breadth of clubs including the possibility of a dance club.

<u>Trips</u>

- Feedback was that trips were very positive and worth while as well as being tailored to the topics carefully across all year groups.
- The dinosaur man visiting in Y1 feedback from parents was that the museum in the previous year was better and could we consider this again for following years. Next year we will definitely review this trip.
- Forest school feedback for the Spring term was that it was jolly cold for the children. Unfortunately the weather is so changeable and out of our control for such trips. We do understand that it is completely out in the elements for a period of two hours and we will look at the timings of these trips for next year as well as the frequency too.

Other Feedback

- Handwriting Club in Y1 and Y2 was a positive club and parents feedback that it was going well for those involved.
- Stay and Plays are a positive part of the school calendar and parents appreciate these sessions.
- Christmas Play Feedback was positive and that there was a feeling that parts were distributed fairly this year.
- Drop ins Parents commented about the frequency with which we have had to postpone these this term. Unfortunately due to external meetings that staff have had to attend this term we have not been in a position to host these every week. We are reviewing how we can do these in the future to avoid cancellations.
- The forum feedback that the teaching team and Head teacher are doing an amazing job. Thank you for feeding this back as we often only look at how we can be better and do better and sometimes forget to reflect on some of the things we do well! It is lovely to receive such feedback!

Swaziland Orphan Choir-Water Bottle Challenge

This week Juanita Hughes talked to the children about the problem of a lack of water in the poor rural communities who don't have access to running water in Swaziland. During the assembly a few children took part in a little game where they experienced what it is like to carry different amounts of water. Juanita works for the charity that raises money to help build water catchment systems to bring water into rural areas. She has launched a fundraising "Water Bottle Challenge" and has asked the children with your help to find an empty bottle and fill it with loose change (silver, gold, or even notes). The money collected will help build these catchment systems.

The children will be bringing home a leaflet about the 'Water Bottle Challenge' in their book bags this week.

Juanita talked to the children about the Orphan town known as Bulembu Choir and the choir that is visiting in June. The Bulembu Tour Choir will be visiting our school on Tuesday 18th June to sing to the children.
